‘Three Janets’ featured in show

“Local Watercolor Masters” was the featured show in the Studio Gallery at Artworks Around Town, Upper Market House, Wheeling, for the month of February 2017. The exhibit included watercolor works by WVWS members **Janet Sheehan** (curator of the exhibit), **Janet Hart**, and **Janet Rodriguez**, plus Wheeling-area artists Jenny Seibert and Bill Rettig. The show opened with a reception on Friday, Feb. 3, 2017.

This edition's featured website is **Simply Painting**, the brainchild of Frank Clarke, an Irish watercolorist and world traveler.

Frank was born in Dublin, Ireland. It was after retiring early from a career that included dress designing and property development that he decided to take up painting as a hobby. He joined a painting group where he felt intimidated and inferior. After six weeks he quit the group because he was told that he did not have the gift.

But he was not one to be easily put off. Whether or not he had the gift he was determined to pursue his hobby. It was then that he made a most unusual discovery: "No one was prepared to show him the basics of painting."

Having read every art instruction book he could get his hands on, Frank came to the conclusion that they all seemed to start at Chapter 4 making the assumption that he had some prior knowledge of painting which of course he did not. It was then that Frank decided to write these missing chapters introducing his "Have Some More Fun system" — and it worked ... "Simply Painting" was born.

Frank's first book became a best seller, outselling all other art teaching books combined in its first year in Ireland. By then Frank had also made his first television series. The success of "Simply Painting" was phenomenal with Frank's book "Frank Clarke's Paintbox — PUBLISHED BY THE BBC" — nestling in the British bestseller list and his "Simply Painting" television series shown on over 250 television stations worldwide.

His second BBC™ book was published in May 2001 and instantly sold out two print runs.

He has made more than 400 programs to date. These shows are broadcast across the world and Frank is a household name in the US, UK, and Australia. Frank has also appeared on all the major chat shows in those countries. Frank has taught millions of people to paint using



his "have some more fun" system through his books, TV programs, videos, seminars and classes.

In August 2003 Frank launched his online art college

His series was recently launched in China and he is currently in the middle of producing a 26-part series based on travels there.

Frank's lessons have run on West Virginia Public Television through the PBS Create series, and I have personally tried many of his lessons. His step-by-step instructions provide almost fool-proof outcomes, and

require only the most basic watercolor materials. Frank has a lighthearted approach and a wonderful sense of humor. He projects confidence and states that anyone can paint. In fact, he asserts, "I can teach anyone to paint — EVEN YOU. That's my promise!"

In our weekly coop, which includes novice, beginner and wannabe painters, as well as veteran artists, we have used the free lessons from the website. Without exception, the painters found each lesson engaging and fun.

Unlike many painters and teachers, Frank uses goat hair brushes. He systematically divides his paper into portions that are consistent with making a clear focus for the finished product. He does this without any academic discussion of thirds/centers/focal points, and instead makes the process seem natural and intuitive. He offers his videos and materials for sale on his website, but he also offers free access to much material. He also posts his YouTube link, and one can watch him work.

I urge you to check out this website, and if you are an art teacher, you may find it useful to refer your students to it as well.

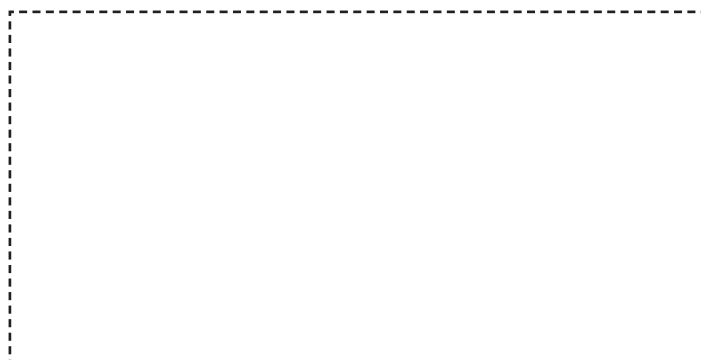
