The WVWS is going to produce a 2026 calendar for sale featuring the artwork of its members. A committee will be looking for West Virginia subject matter in the form of landscape, people, still life, etc. The committee, comprised of WVWS members, will select paintings from the Aqueous 2025 exhibit.

To be eligible, paintings must be produced by a WVWS member (Aqueous is open to non-members). The artists will need to provide a high resolution image (if chosen) and agree to having their painting used for the calendar and publicity purposes. If enough images cannot be found within the show, a "call for images" will be opened up to all members. The image must be a horizontal format as we are going to make this an 8.5"x11" calendar. If your work is selected for the cover, your image will also be inside as one of the featured twelve months.

We want to make this an annual event. Our purpose is to sell these calendars and make some money for WVWS. We will have this printed and available for sale

September 1, 2025 and are asking members to help sell them. Final information/criteria will be in the 2025 Aqueous prospectus.
